



## PhD fellowship “Banking and Financial Economics”

The Graduate School **Global Financial Markets** is a joint Ph.D. programme on global financial markets and international financial stability of the Universities Jena and Halle, Germany. Both Universities conduct a 5 years research and Ph.D. programme especially designed to study global financial markets, their functioning and their stability. The programme offers up to 20 scholarships for Ph.D. students from law and economics. Research is carried out on an interdisciplinary basis from the legal and the economic perspective.

The School is seeking to fill a doctoral position in the field of banking and financial economics in Halle. Applicants should like to work in a truly interdisciplinary team with a focus on the role of multinational banks, and the regulation thereof, for international financial stability.

### JOB QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants should have a profound knowledge of microeconomic theory with applications to banking and financial contracting. They should be interested in institutional aspects of banking regulation and in recent trends to reshape the regulatory system in Europe. Working knowledge of English and German is expected.

Applicants should have an outstanding university degree in economics or finance (MSc or comparable).

### APPLICATIONS/FURTHER INFORMATION:

The fellowships of the Graduate School are funded by the "Stiftung Geld und Wahrung" and are granted for a maximum of three years. The fellowship comprises a grant of 1,150 EUR per month. The successful applicant is expected to work at the premises of the University of Halle.
